What is Title I?

Sardis is identified as a Title I school as part of Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). Title I is designed to support State and local school reform efforts tied to the challenging state academic standards to improve teaching and learning for students. Title I programs must be based on effective means of improving student achievement and include strategies to support family engagement. All Title I schools must jointly develop with parents and family members a written parent and family engagement policy.

School Plan for Shared Student Achievement

What is it?

This is a plan that describes how Sardis Enrichment School (SES) will provide opportunities to improve family engagement to support student learning. Sardis values the contributions and involvement of parents and family members to establish an equal partnership for the common goal of improving student achievement. This plan describes the different ways that Sardis will support family engagement and how parents can help plan and participate in activities and events to promote student learning at school and at home.



How is it revised?

Sardis Enrichment School invited all parents to attend our annual Parent and Family Engagement Meeting last spring to review and revise this parent and family engagement policy, as well as the school wide plan, our school-parent compact, and the family engagement budget. Additionally, parent input and comments regarding this plan are welcome during the school year through an online form. The plan is posted on our school website for parents to view and submit feedback throughout the year. All parent feedback received during the year will be used to revise the plan for the next school year. We also distribute an annual survey online to ask parents for their suggestions on the plan and the use of funds for family engagement. Parents and family members can also give feedback during several parent meetings and activities during the school year.

Who is it for?

All students participating in the Title I, Part A program, and their families are encouraged and invited to fully participate in the opportunities described in this plan. Sardis will provide full opportunity for the participation of parents and family members with limited English, with disabilities, and of migratory children.

Where is it available?

At the beginning of the year, after revision, the policy will be available in the office. The policy will also be posted on our school website, www.ses.hallco.org and emailed through Remind. Parents can also request a copy of the policy from their child's teacher at any time during the school year.



2023-2024 District Goals

Goal 1: By the end of FY24, the percentage of students in each subgroup moving into the “Proficient” and “Distinguished” levels of performance on the Georgia Milestones Assessments will increase by 2% in the “Proficient” and “Distinguished” levels of performance.

Goal 2: Increase the percentage of referred students who access school-based mental health services by 2% each year (with FY21 being the baseline year) to decrease the number of OSS days in grades 6-12.)

2023-2024 School Goals

Goal 1: For the 2023-2024 school year, student foundational skills data will increase as measured by K-2 MAP data.

Goal 2: Build teacher capacity to consistently deliver high-quality Tier 1 instruction, as measured by 90% of Tier 1 walkthroughs demonstrating effective use of learning targets and the components of a mini-lesson.

Goal 3: Measured by the PATHS survey, 90% of students will report a trusted adult at Sardis.

Goal 4: As measured by a Fact Fluency assessment, students in 1st - 5th grades will increase their fact fluency by 5% from beginning to end of year.

School-Parent Compacts

As part of this plan, Sardis and our families will develop a school-parent compact, which is an agreement that parents, teachers, and students will develop that explains how parents and teachers will work together to make sure all our students reach grade-level standards. The compacts will be reviewed and updated annually based on feedback from parents, students, and teachers during the Community

Cares even the School Forum.

The school-parent compacts also are shared with parents during parent-teacher conferences and kept with each child’s teacher if parents need another copy.

Parent Literacy Night – February 15, 2024, 5:30-7pm

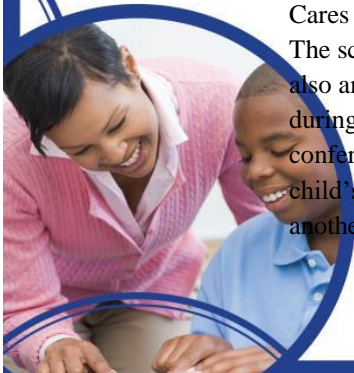
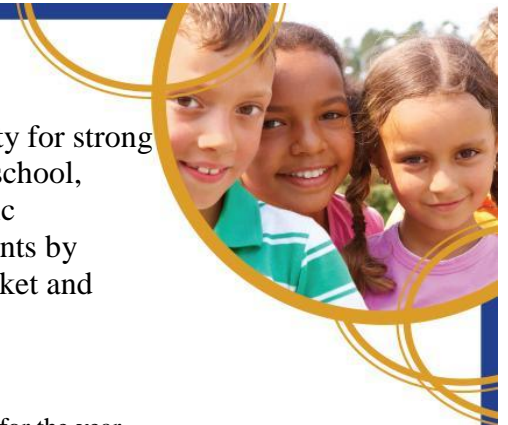
Learn how to make reading fun at home.

Sardis Enrichment School is Branching Out!

Sardis Enrichment School will take the following measures to promote and support parents and family members as an important foundation of the school in order to strengthen the school and reach our school goals. We will:

- Ensure that all information related to school and parent programs, meetings, and other activities is published in both English and Spanish, posted on the school website, and included in the monthly school newsletter for all families.
- Participate in Canvas professional development modules at least four times per year to educate staff on strategies to improve communication with parents and ideas to increase family engagement. Staff will also share best practices during regularly scheduled faculty meetings.
- Partner with early childhood programs, middle and high schools, college and career ready resources or organizations, parent resource centers, or other programs (as applicable) to help prepare parents and their children for successful school transitioning.
- Share information in English and Spanish on the school website and in the school Bulletin for parents to understand the school's academic standards and assessments as well as the ways parents can monitor their child's progress and work with educators.
- Communicate with all families and the community on a regular basis regarding school wide events and activities, through phone messages, social media, and flyers.
- Partner with Head Start through the District Parent Outreach Facilitator. The District Parent Outreach Facilitator meets with parents and families providing information and resources to support school orientation for parents, families, and students to assist in successful student transitions to kindergarten.
- Provide necessary materials and handouts for parents at conferences, meetings, and activities to help parents work with their child to improve their child's achievement.
- Offer literacy and mathematics classes for parents and family members to help further enhance their various educational levels.
- Collect feedback from parents and family members at all events, place input cards around the building and post a suggestion form on the school website in order to respond to parents' requests for additional support for parent and family engagement activities.
